#### <u>Government Advocacy Committee (GAC) Chair – Billy Austin</u>

**U.N.** Climate Report Urges Accelerated Actions to Secure a Livable Future

On March 20, the IPCC released its Sixth Assessment Report, which comprises 3 Working Group reports along with a synthesis report. Despite widespread policies to combat climate change, the report finds that "the pace and scale of what has been done so far, and current plans, are insufficient to tackle climate change." The planet is already at 1.1°C above pre-industrial levels, causing a variety of adverse impacts that are expected to intensify. Keeping global temperature increases to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels **requires emissions to be cut by almost** 



half by 2030. The report concludes that accelerated actions are needed, both to mitigate greenhouse gas emissions and to adapt to climate change through climate-resilient development. Financing is also critical, and three to six times the current climate investment is estimated to be needed to rapidly reduce emissions and for developing countries to meet adaptation needs.
